U.S. Navy Blue Angels Flight Demonstration Squadron Heads to Bell Fort Worth Alliance Air Show Oct. 19-20

General admission is free, parking and premium seating discounts available in advance online

FORT WORTH, TEXAS (Oct. 1, 2019) — The U.S. Navy Blue Angels Flight Demonstration Squadron will soar through North Texas skies at the Bell Fort Worth Alliance Air Show Oct. 19-20. General admission is free, and parking and premium seating discounts are available in advance of the show at www.allianceairshow.com. Gates open at 9 A.M., and aerial activity begins around 10 A.M. both days. Come early, as this year's performer scheduler has changed. The F-22 Raptor Demo team and F-16 Viper Demo will perform in the morning, followed by the U.S. Navy Blue Angels set to perform around NOON (time and performers subject to change).

For the first time ever, the Bell Fort Worth Alliance Air Show will include a free concert, "Salute to the Heroes," presented by the Air Power Foundation, to close out each day. On Saturday, Austin Allsup from "The Voice" will perform. Sunday's show will feature Scooter Brown Band.
